Philly lacks the offense to be expected to win by such a large margin, scoring just 86.2 PPG (42.5\% FG) in its past six games.

Dallas has won five in a row SU (4-1 ATS) against the Rockets, including a two-point overtime win in Houston on Saturday. The Mavs are in great position to knock off the Rockets again, as Houston has been terrible on the road all season, going 8-16 SU and 9-14-1 ATS (39\%) on the year, and 2-6 SU and 2-5-1 ATS since the All-Star break. The Rockets have also dropped all three of their road games that came one night after a home game (SU and ATS) by 16.7 PPG.
