### StatFox Dave

StatFox Dave is one of the original four founders of StatFox and over the years has been renowned for his handicapping prowess in all sports. Anyone who signed up for our NBA postseason Best Bets certainly knows that to be true, as Dave racked up an astounding 66% success rate on Best Bets during the NBA postseason. Dave had a banner week in his college football picks, going 14-2 ATS. That increases his season win percentage to a stellar 65%, as he's 18 games over .500. Dave has also turned a profit in his college football Best Bets.

### StatFox Gary

StatFox Gary joined the StatFox and Platinum Sheet staff prior to the 2010 football season, and subscribers were certainly happy he did: He proceeded to post a 55% success rate on NFL Best Bets in his "rookie" season. Gary continues his surge on college football Best Bets by going 4-1 ATS in Week 4, making him 6-2 ATS (75%) over the past two weeks. Gary's two Pac-12 picks were spoton-USC winning big over Cal and Oregon crushing Arizona 49-0. Even more impressive was his pick of 14.5-point underdog Kansas State, which beat Oklahoma straight up.
