Although the Pacers won four straight meetings (after the Bucks had won six in a row), only one of the four victories was a blowout (125-104) with the other three wins coming by 6, 1 and 6 points. Milwaukee is a stellar 8-2 (SU and ATS) in its past 10 road games, averaging a hefty 109.6 PPG on 50% FG and 39% threes, while allowing just 96.4 PPG (13.2 PPG margin) on 43.9% FG (31.5% threes) in these 10 contests. Indiana is 11-14 ATS as a home favorite.

Phoenix is 29-14 ATS (67.4%) in the past three seasons after allowing 100+ points in four straight games.
