GAME BREAKDOWN: The Dolphins have come up just short the past two weeks, blowing a late lead in Arizona before losing in overtime in Week 4. They discovered a potent combination in rookie QB Ryan Tannehill (431 passing yards vs. ARI) and WR Brian Hartline (253 receiving yards vs. ARI) in that game, and they could be a handful for a weak Bengals pass defense. Cincinnati has generally handled teams they should beat over the past two seasons, and so far they're 3-0 SU (2-0-1 ATS) against opponents that didn't make last year's playoffs. WR A.J. Green has been near unstoppable the past two weeks (15 catches, 300 yards).

Anyone who signed up for our NBA postseason Best Bets certainly knows that to be true, as Dave racked up an astounding 66% success rate on Best Bets during the NBA postseason. Dave has been on fire in his college picks over the past two weeks, going 24-7-1 ATS (77.4%) overall and 9-5 ATS on his Best Bets. He predicted that North Carolina would "score 60 points in a rout" against Idaho last week. The final score: UNC 66, Idaho 0.

StatFox Gary

StatFox Gary joined the StatFox and Platinum Sheet staff prior to the 2010 football season, and subscribers were certainly happy he did: He proceeded to post a 55% success rate on NFL Best Bets in his "rookie" season. Gary also has a knack for college over/unders, finishing the bowl season 4-1 in his Best Bet totals. Gary has already racked up winning weeks in college football Best Bets three times this season, going a combined 8-3 ATS (73%) in these three stellar weeks. This includes his 4-1 mark two weeks ago, highlighted by Kansas State winning outright at Oklahoma.
