The Clippers offense has been horrible in the past seven games (1-6 ATS), scoring just 90.3 PPG on 43% FG. And now they get to face an angry Thunder team coming off a defeat in Utah. This is quite a challenge considering OKC is 10-1 (9-2 ATS) following an SU loss, outscoring these 11 opponents by 11.4 PPG. The Thunder are also 7-4 ATS in the second part of their past 11 back-to-backs, and 6-3 ATS in their past nine when favored by more than 8 points.
