The Magic have scored 85 points or fewer nine times this season, and Wolves dynamic point guard Ricky Rubio will give Orlando fits on both ends of the court (8.7 APG, 2.5 SPG).

L.A. beat the Mavs in January despite playing without Chris Paul, and the Clippers are 7-4 SU and 6-4-1 ATS on the road with Paul in the lineup. He has been tremendous versus Dallas in his career with 22.8 PPG (52% FG, 46% 3-pt FG), 8.6 APG, 5.1 RPG and 2.5 SPG.

Both teams are playing their best basketball of the season, but Phoenix was held to 89 points versus Houston on Thursday while Golden State torched the Rockets for 106 (13-of-24 three-pointers) three days later. In the past five games, the Warriors are scoring 111.2 PPG on 49% FG and 48% 3-pt FG, thanks in part to red-hot Monta Ellis averaging 29.2 PPG in these five contests. Ellis has also burned the Suns for 29.6 PPG in the past five home meetings.
