The Clippers have played nine road games since the start of February, going 6-3 (SU and ATS). L.A. has also been a great bet as a favorite, going 15-5 SU (12-7-1 ATS, 63%). Phoenix will get its points, but if this game is a shootout, the Clippers should prevail. In the last five seasons, well-rested (six or less games in 14 days) NBA road teams are 31-8 ATS in games where the line is +3 to -3 after a road game in which both teams scored 100 or more points.

The Blazers are usually unstoppable at home, but they have been very ordinary at Rose Garden in the past month, going 2-5 (SU and ATS). The Timberwolves have lost two straight on the road, but that was with an ill Kevin Love on a brutal back-toback-to-back. For the season, the Wolves are 10-4 ATS (71%) as an underdog of six points or fewer. Portland is 5-7 ATS within the same spread range when favored, including 2-5 ATS in the past seven such instances.

Boston has won nine of 10 vs. New York but the difference in this one could be less statistical and more strategic. Jeremy Lin's success has been largely based on his ability to run the pick-and-roll, and Celtics PF Kevin Garnett is arguably the best pick-and-roll defender ever. He'll likely play center with Jermaine O'Neal out. That would match Garnett up with Tyson Chandler, Lin's primary pick-and-roll partner, which will cause problems for New York.

The Heat have owned this series lately with seven straight ATS wins, including four straight SU victories by 9.0 PPG. On Jan. 19, Miami led L.A. by 21 points after three quarters despite not having Dwyane Wade, who averages 25.1 PPG when facing the Lakers in his career. Kobe Bryant made just 8-of-21 FG in that January loss, while LeBron James had 31 points, eight rebounds, eight assists and four steals. Since 2004, James has a 10-2 record versus Los Angeles.
