A featured writer on StatFox.com and for Platinum Sheet, StatFox Brian has yet to suffer a losing season of Platinum Sheet Best Bets in either college football, NFL, college basketball or NBA since coming on board in 2010. Brian has started the football season red-hot in both college and pro football, correctly picking **62% (32-20-1 ATS)** Best Bets, including **65% (15-8-1 ATS)** in NFL Best Bets.

**StatFox Scott**

StatFox Scott serves as Managing Editor for StatFox, Platinum Sheet and the Edge Football Preview Guide, and is coming off two straight profitable college football seasons, winning a whopping 59% of his games ATS in 2010 followed by 53% ATS in 2011. Scott had a second straight identical 3-1 week in NFL Totals, and improves to an outstanding **16-7-1 Totals record (70%)** this season.

**GAME BREAKDOWN:** Minnesota has tightened up their play this year, but their offense is still finding its way. The Vikings had just 209 yards of offense in last week's win over Arizona, the second time in four weeks they've won while gaining less than 230 yards. The Bucs haven't won SU on the road since beating Minnesota last September (nine straight losses, 3-6 ATS) but have covered in both their 2012 road games. QB Josh Freeman has thrown for 349.0 YPG, seven TDs and only two picks over his last three games. The Bucs pulled off a comeback, 24-20 win in Minnesota a year ago, driving 61 yards for the winning TD with 31 seconds left.

**GAME BREAKDOWN:** The Panthers have another chance to turn around their nightmare start to the year, though this will be their toughest test so far. The Panthers have lost their last three games by less than a touchdown. When these teams met at Soldier Field last October, the Bears ran all over Carolina, gaining 224 on the ground and pulling away in the fourth quarter (a meaningless TD with four seconds left gave the Panthers the cover in a 34-29 loss). Cam Newton threw for 374 yards in that game, but hasn't thrown for 300 since the season opener and has a 5-to-6 TD/INT ratio this year.

**GAME BREAKDOWN:** The Chargers have reverted to their sloppy ways in blowing leads in each of their last two games. San Diego had six turnovers and nine penalties in their Monday night collapse against Denver two weeks ago, but they've played well on the road. They had won three road games in a row, SU and ATS, before losing a close game in New Orleans in Week 5. **GAME BREAKDOWN:** Green Bay should be able to keep their hot streak going when they host the atrocious Jaguars on Sunday. Jacksonville will be without their best player, RB Maurice Jones-Drew (foot), and QB Blaine Gabbert suffered an injury to his non-throwing shoulder last week (though that might be addition by subtraction). Since blowing a big lead in Indy three weeks ago, the Packers have bounced back with impressive road wins in Houston and St. Louis. QB Aaron Rodgers is absolutely on fire, completing 71.4% of his passes and averaging 308.5 YPG with 16 TDs and just two INTs over his last four.

StatFox Dave is one of the original four founders of StatFox and over the years has been renowned for his handicapping prowess in all sports. Anyone who signed up for our NBA postseason Best Bets certainly knows that to be true, as Dave racked up an astounding 66% success rate on Best Bets during the NBA postseason. Dave has been stellar in his college picks over the past five weeks, going 53-25-2 ATS (68%) overall. That puts him at a whopping 64% ATS (79-45-3) for the entire season. Dave has also posted a profitable 57% ATS on his Best Bets (29-22) for the season.

**StatFox Gary**

StatFox Gary joined the StatFox and Platinum Sheet staff prior to the 2010 football season, and subscribers were certainly happy he did: He proceeded to post a 55% success rate on NFL Best Bets in his "rookie" season. Gary also has a knack for college over/unders, finishing the bowl season 4-1 in his Best Bet totals. Gary has been on a roll in the past three weeks, going 5-2 ATS (71%) on his Best Bets, highlighted by last week's prediction that Stanford (-3) would win at California due to a great rushing offense. The Cardinal outrushed the Bears 252 to 3 in a 21-3 win.

**StatFox Scott**

StatFox Scott serves as Managing Editor for Stat-Fox and Platinum Sheet and the Edge Football Preview Guide, and is coming off a two-year college football run in which his Best Bets success rate was 56%. Scott isn't afraid to wager on any FBS game. **GAME BREAKDOWN:** Clemson has won 10 of the past 13 meetings (6-6-1 ATS), scoring 99 points during three straight wins over Wake Forest. Tigers QB Tajh Boyd, who threw for 347 yards, 2 TD and 2 INT in last year's 31-28 win versus Wake, has led his team to 130 points during a three-game win streak. The Demon Deacons have won three of four ATS, winning outright at Virginia last week, 16-10, despite just 213 total yards. They will not have leading WR Michael Campanaro, who had targeted this date for a return from a broken hand.

**GAME BREAKDOWN:** Cincinnati has won each of the past four meetings (3-1 ATS) with Louisville by at least eight points, prevailing 25-16 last year at home. The Bearcats played their first true road game last week and lost 29-23 at Toledo despite not allowing the Rockets to score an offensive touchdown. Louisville barely stayed unbeaten with a 27-25 home win over South Florida as QB Teddy Bridgewater was nearly perfect throwing the football (21-of-25, 256 yds, 2 TD, 0 INT). Bridgewater has completed 73.4 percent of his passes in 2012.

**GAME BREAKDOWN:** This is the first-ever meeting between these two schools, which both rank among the seven best rushing teams in the nation. Nevada has the FBS leading ground gainer in Stephon Jefferson (156 rush YPG) who has 680 rushing yards and 12 TD in four road games this season. Air Force is second in the country with 353 rushing YPG, but its top rusher Cody Getz (133 rush YPG, 4th in FBS) did not play last week (ankle). The Wolf Pack have dropped four straight ATS, while the Falcons have lost three in a row ATS.

The Nittany Lions have won five straight SU and six in a row ATS. Matt McGloin has 1,788 passing yards (255 YPG), 14 TD and just 2 INT this year.

The Wolverines rolled to a 45-17 win over the Huskers last year as Denard Robinson (263 total yds, 4 TD) outplayed Nebraska QB Taylor Martinez (171 total yds, 1 TD) and Fitzgerald Toussaint outrushed Rex Burkhead 138 to 36 with two scores. Burkhead re-injured his knee in last week's 29-28 win over Northwestern and is questionable for Saturday. Michigan has held five straight opponents to 13 points or less.

**GAME BREAKDOWN:** Alabama is 9-2 SU (5-6 ATS) in the past 11 meetings, including four straight wins by a combined score of 117 to 27. Last year was the closest of the four, a 24-7 Tide road win. Unbeaten Mississippi State leads the nation in turnover margin (+17) and is riding a three-game ATS win streak with 113 points (37.7 PPG) during this run. Alabama leads the nation in scoring defense (8.3 PPG) and total defense (196 YPG), while A.J. McCarron leads all FBS players in passing efficiency (69% completions, 9.6 YPA, 16 TD, 0 INT).

Situational analysis uncovers conditions and patterns where teams have consistently outperformed or underperformed their normal levels. These systems are not team specific—the principle is that teams fall into patterns regardless of personnel (i.e. good passing teams, teams seeking revenge, cold teams on a losing streak, etc.).

The Aggies turned the ball over five times in their 24-19 loss to LSU last week, snapping a five-game win streak in which they averaged 53.0 PPG. Auburn hasn't won a regulation game in 2012, losing four in a row (2-2 ATS) since topping ULM in overtime. The Tigers have the third-fewest yards in FBS (277 YPG) and are tied for the third-fewest points (15.7 PPG), failing to top 20 points in all six losses.

**GAME BREAKDOWN:** Texas hasn't lost to Kansas since 1938, winning nine straight (8-1 ATS) by a total score of 415 to 128 (31.9 PPG margin). Last year, the Longhorns won 43-0, out-rushing the Jayhawks 441 (6.1 YPC) to minus-2 yards on 20 carries. Texas ranks sixth in the nation with 44.4 PPG after beating Baylor 56-50 behind 5 TD from RB Joe Bergeron. But UT's defense has allowed 161 points (53.7 PPG) during a current three-game ATS skid. However, the Kansas offense has just 15.0 PPG during a six-game SU losing streak (2-3-1 ATS).
